WELCOME: *We begin without music and without the typical greeting.*

Presider 1: At this hour, O God Most High,
while silence reigns

FIRST READING: **Isaiah 52:13 – 53:12**

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: *My God, My God* *Marty Haugen*

Refrain: My God, my God, O why have you abandoned me?

SECOND READING: **Hebrews 4:14-16;5:7-9**

Gospel Acclamation: *Return to God*

GC 389

Return to God with all your heart, the source of grace and mercy; come seek the tender faithfulness of God.

If you break the chains of oppression, if you set the pris'ner free;
if you share your bread with the hungry, give protection to the lost;
give a shelter to the homeless, clothe the naked in your midst,
then your light shall break forth like the dawn.

GOSPEL READING: **John 18:1 – 19:42**

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION:

UNIVERSAL PRAYER: (General Intercessions)

Each prayer has two parts. After the reader says, "For this we pray:" respond, "**Christ Crucified, Jesus Hear our Prayer.**" At the second part, respond, "**Amen.**"

Veneration of the Cross

Presider: The cross is held up in our midst in three places. We will be invited to come forward as we express our reverence with a kiss, a bow, a gentle touch, or a genuflection. For those on Zoom, if you have a cross handy, use it as we mediate and venerate the cross.

Meditation Hymn: *Behold the Wood of the Cross*

Presider: Christ on the cross bows His head waiting for you, that he may kiss you;
His arms outstretched, that he may embrace you;
His hands are open, that he may enrich you;
His side is open for you that he may let you enter there.

THE GREATEST PRAYER:

Presider: With our eyes fixed on Jesus, whose blood was shed by intolerance, anger, and fear, let us seek pardon and peace from God as we pray:

Introduction to Holy Communion

Presider: Behold the Lamb of God, God's Suffering Servant, our Wounded Healer, who takes away the sins of the world. How blessed we all are to be called to this table.

Response: **God, I am not worthy to receive you, only say the word and we are healed.**

Presider: Throughout Jesus' ministry, he called everyone, without exception, to dine at the table with him. He fed everyone, without exception. Christ has no body on earth now but yours. And so, we are called to come to the table and to feed one another with the body of Christ.

We ask you to wait till everyone has received the Eucharist so that we may receive the Eucharist together
